Preschool Conferences:

During Junior Jakes and Jakes Preschool, your child's teacher will hold two conferences: one in the fall and then again in spring. To prepare for conferences, consider doing the following:



1. Ask your child (before conferences) how he or she feels about school.
 - What does he or she like best?
 - What does he or she like least?
2. During the conference, ask questions like-
 - How is my child's participation in class?
 - Does my child seem happy in school?
 - What can I do at home to strengthen my child's reading and math skills?
