



WE ARE HIRING



Aitkin High School has an opening for an individual to serve as AmeriCorps Promise Fellows. Promise Fellows are caring, supportive adults that help students engage in school and community. These service positions pair community members directly with students in need of support during the 2023/24 school year. Promise Fellows receive a living allowance, health and dental insurance, an education award upon successful completion of service, and ongoing professional development training and can have a flexible schedule working 20-40 hours per week.

AmeriCorps service is a great opportunity to support students that are struggling with attendance and school work, or are having a hard time connecting with school and may lack connections to caring adults, academic support, or opportunities to feel like part of their community. The community of Aitkin High School is bringing an AmeriCorps member into the school to increase the capacity and resources available to help students succeed.









For the 2023/2024 school year, Kids Club is open to all kids enrolled in our preschool or elementary school. Kids Club is open at 6:45 before school and until 5:30 after school. It is open on select non-school days when there are teacher inservice or parent conferences. Last year we started a Preschool Wrap Around program, which allowed kids in ½ day programs to attend Kids Club when they were not in preschool. Based on this year's ACC schedule, Kids Club will be open to 3 and 4 year olds during the days on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for preschool children enrolled in the Aitkin Children's Center. Different this year, families will commit to a consistent schedule for the year. There will not be the drop-in option or flexible schedule. This is due to the high demand and limited availability.







Save Receipts For Your Child's Education Expenses

If you're buying school supplies for your children in kindergarten through 12th grade, you may qualify for one or both of these tax relief programs:

- K-12 Education Subtraction
- K-12 Education Credit

Save your receipts, because both programs can help lower your taxes and may provide a larger refund when filing your Minnesota income tax return.

Last year, more than 17,500 families received the K-12 Education Credit and saved an average of \$282. Over 138,000 families received the K-12 Education Subtraction with an average subtraction of \$1,285.

Common Expenses That Qualify:

- · School supplies (pencils, paper, calculators)
- · Educational computer hardware and software
- · Tutoring K-12 curriculum by a qualified instructor
- · Rental or purchase of musical instruments used during school

Expenses That Do Not Qualify:

- School supplies not used in education (backpacks, tissues, organizers)
- Clothing, including school uniforms (except required gym clothes)
- School lunches
- Family trip to museum or zoo

Do I qualify?

To qualify for either the credit or subtraction, both of these must be true:

- You purchased educational services or materials to assist with your child's education
- Your child is attending kindergarten through 12th grade at a public, private, or home school

Income limits for Each Program

K-12 Education Credit: Your adjusted gross income must be below the levels shown here. If you qualify for the credit, you must file a Minnesota return to claim a refund.

K-12 Education Subtraction: There are no income limits for the education subtraction.

Letter From Superintendent

As we prepare for the next school year throughout the summer, you can feel the excitement building as we look to what our future holds. The buildings are being cleaned, programs are being reviewed and updated and all the summer programs are already beginning to wrap up.. There is never really a slow time in a public school, learning is a continuous process. And that is all right!

The district has been involved in two different planning processes. Last fall Aitkin Schools participated in a facilities review and we have been prioritizing both long and short term needs. This work identified some facilities issues that need to be addressed within our district

This spring the school board moved to replace our tennis courts. The Don Hagenstuen Tennis facility will have a new look as a new 7 tennis court facility which will be available to our student athletes this fall.

We are also in the process of getting a new look in the Old Gym at the high school. Jason Cline and Rob Williams have received funds from different civic organizations in Aitkin to provide for a new paint job and they are replacing all the wood board seats with new boards that do not have many coats of paint on them. This not only has been a community event to raise funds, but also most of the labor has been volunteers. Once again showing that Gobbler Spirit and Pride.

The second part of our plan is to review and create a new Strategic Plan. Last spring our school board contracted with the Minnesota School Board Association (MSBA) to work with us and help us create a current Strategic Plan. There are three opportunities to provide input into the process. First we have just launched the community survey. You can find the link to the survey on our school website. We hope that people who live in the Aitkin Public School district fill out one survey to help us gather information to help us create a Strategic Plan.

The first listening session is tentatively scheduled for September 12, 2023. There will be 5 different stakeholder meetings scheduled throughout the day.

Finally, we will be looking for community members to be a part of the Strategic Planning Committee. The Committee will include representatives from all school community stakeholder groups including students, staff (licensed and non-licensed), community representatives (parents, business, alumni, residents), administrators, and all school board members. If you would like to be considered as a committee member please submit your name to Jeanne Ince in the District office by August 28, 2023. The school district will consider all names submitted to ensure that a cross-section of stakeholders is represented on the Strategic Planning Committee. The committee will meet a minimum of 3 times for about 2 hours at a time. The meetings will be in the evening this fall starting at 6:30.

As we look to the future of the school district we need to plan for years to come. We have completed updates to the High School that we believe will provide for the needs of our district for the next 20 plus years. What are our next steps when it comes to the facilities and programming?

This is what the facilities and strategic planning processes will help us address. Our elementary building has not had the same renovations over the past 5 or 6 years as the high school. It is a facility that has and continues to serve our district well, but it is in need of major renovations in the near future. Is it time we as a school district and community look to build our new footprint on the land the district purchased 8 - 10 years ago?.


With a solid planning process that creates workable plans, we will be able to keep ISD #1 on the right track and moving forward.


